



Alberta renewable energy announcement

Announcement of departure comes on the heels of contested Alberta renewable energy moratorium On Aug. 3, 2023, the Alberta government announced a seven-month moratorium on all new renewable energy projects, much to the surprise of the industry.

On March 11, 2024, the Minister of Affordability and Utilities (MUA) directed the Alberta Electric System Operator (AESO) and the Alberta Market Surveillance Administrator (MSA) to commence drafting a technical design proposal for a Restructured Energy Market (REM). This directive was influenced by informed recommendations from the respective reports of the AESO and the MSA.

In an unprecedented move, the Alberta Minister of Affordability and Utilities issued a surprise announcement on August 3, 2023, that the Alberta Utilities Commission (AUC or Commission) was directed to pause approvals in respect of new renewable electricity generation projects until at least February 29, 2024, to facilitate a review of the policies and procedures ...
