However, it's important to note that "free" solar panels are not always a scam, but they do require careful consideration. These "free" solar panels are typically offered through solar panel leases or power purchase agreements (PPAs), which allow individuals to install solar panels without the high expense.

Do Americans get free solar panels?

American homeowners might be eligible for federal tax credits for solar installations or state subsidies for solar energy, but not free panels. The U.S. government does not provide free solar panels, said a U.S. Department of Energy spokesperson. The department urges people to report scams to the .

Does the government offer free solar panels?

While the government isn't offering free solar panels, it offers a tax credit that can be claimed on federal income taxes for those who use solar power on residential property. The credit was increased and extended through 2034 by the Inflation Reduction Act.

Are free solar panels worth it?

"Free" solar panels will save you money because energy from solar power is usually less expensive than energy from the electrical grid. Keep in mind, however, that these savings from solar energy are possible regardless of if your solar panels are leased versus purchased. The long-term cost savings help you determine if solar panels are worth it.

Is there a tax credit for solar panels?
