The Aspen community⁴ will purchase 100% of its electrical energy from renewable sources [by a date TBD]. While Aspen Electric is 100% renewable, net electricity consumption in the Aspen EIB is powered by 49% fossil resources and 51% renewable resources. Therefore, the Aspen community does not meet this target.

Beyond sunseting coal power plants, the state is aiming for a 100% renewable energy grid by 2040. "That is just an amazing, huge transition in such a short period of time," Gomez said. As renewable energy swoops in to replace all that coal power, Colorado's capacity to produce it will more than double by the end of the decade.
