Is Avista a private utility?

Avista is an investor-owned utility, often referred to as an IOU or private utility. As an IOU, shareholders invest money that the company uses to conduct business and provide safe, reliable energy to customers. Our shareholders come from all walks of life, many also being customers of the utility.

Does Avista own power?

Avista owns its own hydroelectric, biomass, coal and natural gas generation facilities and has contracts to purchase power, including wind power, from market suppliers. (Purchased power meets 25 percent of Avista's customer needs. Power is primarily purchased from the Bonneville Power Administration (BPA).

Will Avista turn off power if weather is forecast?

SPOKANE, Wash., May 07, 2024 (GLOBE NEWSWIRE) -- Avista is adding a new strategy to its wildfire mitigation plan. The utility announced today at a press conference with regional partners that if extreme weather conditions are forecast, like low humidity and strong winds, Avista may turn off power in specific locations to help protect public safety.

Located in Lind, WA., part of Avista's electric service territory, the array is comprised of 81,700 panels and generate enough electricity to supply approximately 4,000 homes annually.

Battery chargers or power adapters for devices like cell phones, eBooks and more may draw power even when they're not in use--don't let them. Use power strips. Plug your video game consoles, stereo, DVD players and any other home electronics into a single power strip so you can switch it off and cut all power to items at once.

Smart meters measure energy consumption and transmit that data securely via wireless communications to a nearby router installed on a utility power pole. Network routers send data from all the meters in their area to Avista via a secure cellular signal. They also communicate with the meters to help us troubleshoot and resolve problems more quickly.

If you decide installing solar panels is right for you, make sure you secure several bids, view a list of qualified contractors and learn about connecting to Avista's power grid. Lisa, an Avista customer, has been writing about the energy savings she implemented in her 1908 home.
