Can you put mothballs in a closet?

Common misunderstandings: Mothballs should not be placed in closets, attics, basements, storage chests or trunks, garment bags or other spaces other than in tightly closed containers as explained above. Gasses from the mothballs escape into the air and can cause respiratory problems. Can you put mothballs under house?

How do you store mothballs?

Mothballs must only be used in enclosed, airtight containers. Choose plastic containers and garment bags you can close up and store in the closet or under the bed. Lay the clothes inside the container. Moths eat animal products such as wool, leather, and felt. They will chew through synthetic fibers to get to animal stains like sweat.

Can mothballs be stored in airtight containers?

Mothballs can be stored in airtight containers or sealed airtight garment bags. This will not only prevent the fumes from spreading in your home but also ensure the mothballs work effectively. After putting the mothballs, seal the container tightly or zip the airtight garment bags.

How to keep mothballs out of clothes?

To keep mothballs away from clothes in the closet, start by cleaning the airtight garment bags or sealed containers that you will use to store the clothes. You can use a disinfectant spray or just plain water to clean the bags or containers and then wipe them nicely after cleaning.

How long do mothballs last in the closet?

A single mothball typically lasts 3-6 months in the closet. When placed with clothes in airtight garment bags or sealed containers, they can last up to 12 months. However, the length of time mothballs last in the closet depends on room temperature and surrounding environmental conditions.

Where should you put mothballs in a shed?

Mothballs are small, but if you place them strategically you can protect your whole space. Place them near objects that attract pests the most, such as potted plants, or near entrances and exits. You can also place mothballs around the exterior perimeter of your shed to protect your things from pests.
