The White House itself once harvested the power of the sun. On June 20, 1979, the Carter administration installed 32 panels designed to harvest the sun's rays and use them to heat water.

When were solar panels installed on the White House?

The first solar panels were placed on the White House more than 30 years earlier by Jimmy Carter (and removed by the very next administration.) George W. Bush installed a system on the grounds, but they weren't technically on the White House roof itself.

What happened to the solar panels at the White House?

The panels heated water at the White House until Carter's successor, President Ronald Reagan, removed them in 1986 during the resurfacing of the White House roof. The solar panels remained in a government storage facility for about five years after Reagan removed them.

How many solar panels were on the roof of the White House?

Solar panels, some 32 of them, were on the roof of the White House. The set was just right -- the sun had come out for the press as though for a stage call. Tape rolled, the cameras snapped.

The History of Solar Energy at the White House. President Jimmy Carter installed the first solar panels, generating carbon-free electricity on the West Wing roof of the White House in 1979. According to the White House Historical Association, the President called for a campaign to conserve energy and set an example to the American people.

they manage on White House grounds, marking a semi-return to the use of solar power. The Bush Administration did not publicize the installations, which reportedly now heat the White House pool.

The panels were stored in a government warehouse until 1991, when they were acquired by Unity College in Maine. The college installed some of the panels to heat their cafeteria water. This solar panel is one of the original Carter White House panels and was donated to the National Museum of American History by Unity College in 2009.

Carter's panels were not meant to completely heat or cool the White House; they heated water exclusively. The solar panels installed on the White House in 1979 were crafted from glass, stainless steel and aluminum;

when the panels were unveiled, the sun was out as if poised for a Washington photo op.

True to his promise, Carter had a set of solar-thermal panels installed on the roof of the White House later that year. Sun light shone onto the absorber plates, heating them up, and transferring this solar energy ...

In 1979, he commissioned 32 solar water heating panels to be installed on the roof of the White House. Their purpose was to heat water for the cafeteria and laundry room. However, Carter's solar panels didn't long outlive his tenure at the White House. Carter did install nearly 4,000 solar panels on his farm in Plains, Georgia in 2017, though.
