For this reason it is sometimes described as centralized government, although the two ...

How does the distribution of national and state power in a unitary system compare to that of a federal system of government? In a unitary system, the national government holds most policy-making authority, and in a federal system, policy-making authority is shared among the national government and regional or state governments.

How does a unitary system differ from a federal system in terms of power distribution? A unitary system differs from a federal system mainly in its concentration of power. In a unitary system, all significant authority resides with the central government, which can delegate power to local authorities but retains the right to withdraw it.

Federal government as contra-distinguished from unitary government, is a system in which the totality of governmental power is divided and distributed by the national constitution or the organic act of parliament creating it, between a central government and the governments of the individual states or other territorial
