How do I dispose of a lithium-ion battery?

When the lithium-ion battery in your Dell Vostro 1400 no longer holds a charge, contact your local waste disposal or environmental agency for advice on disposal (see 'Battery Disposal' in the Product Information Guide). **CAUTION:** Misuse of the battery may increase the risk of fire or chemical burn.

Where can I recycle a lithium battery?

They also hold many useful (and finite) resources that can be reused. If you've got a lithium battery you need to dispose of, recycling services are readily available. You can drop small, handheld lithium batteries (the type found in phones and smart wearables) into dedicated bins at Woolworths and Aldi stores.

How do I dispose of old batteries?

At home, put your recyclable batteries in a designated container ensuring positive and negative ends don't touch; to avoid risk of fire. In some places, supermarkets also provide safe recycling bins for old batteries. You can also pop into your local fire station for advice and assistance.

Where can I recycle rechargeable batteries?

Rechargeable batteries CAN be recycled at participating retail locations including the following: Radio Shack, Best Buy, Staples, Target, Office Max, Lowes, Home Depot, Sears, Wal-Mart and Veri-zon Wireless. Are alkaline batteries hazardous waste?

Alkaline batteries now fall below Federal and State hazardous waste standards and can be disposed of in the regular trash. **WHAT TYPES OF BATTERIES SHOULD I RECYCLE?** Recycle all Rechargeable Batteries.

How do you prevent a battery from short circuiting during transport?

New Federal regulations have been enacted to prevent short circuiting of batteries during transport. Residents must individually bag each battery or tape each of the terminal end prior to recycling.

These facilities can typically also accept other hazardous waste like paint, batteries, cleaning products, and other items. Since fire extinguishers have specific disposal requirements, your local fire department may also accept old extinguishers, or provide you with the right disposal method for fire safety products.

Donate or recycle lithium-ion batteries. These are the kinds of batteries that typically power portable electronics like your mobile phone, digital camera, tablet, or laptop. Lithium-ion batteries can be recycled at a recycling center or hazardous waste collection site, or donated to refurbishers and recyclers.

When you know how to dispose of batteries, you can help the environment. Dropoff sites typically accept rechargeable batteries for recycling. For single-use batteries, you can get a mail-order recycling kit. Putting alkaline batteries in ...

Discharging a LiPo battery fully makes it safe for disposal. Plug the battery into the charger and place them in a fireproof container. Turn the charger on to the "discharge" setting. Set the voltage to 0, and change the discharge rate to the one printed on the battery.

Depending on which kind of battery you are recycling, battery components can become many different new products. Battery manufacturers frequently recycle spent battery components directly into new batteries. Steel can be recycled into kitchenware such as pots and pans, and silverware or cups and plates. It can sometimes be turned into asphalt.

There is a wrong way to do it, though. You should never throw away electronics with your regular trash. Many of the components---especially batteries---can be harmful or dangerous if not disposed of properly. That doesn't happen if you're just taking it to the curb. Sell, donate, or recycle, but don't trash an old phone.

Since the New Jersey Dry Cell Battery Management Act was adopted in 1991 and the Federal Mercury-Containing and Rechargeable Battery Management Act was adopted in 1996, household battery manufacturers have begun manufacturing alkaline batteries with no added mercury and have reduced the amount of mercury added to other batteries.
