

# Mountain in japan with large lake for backup power

How is Nakaumi lake connected to the Sea of Japan?

The Sakai Channel connects Nakaumi Lake to the Sea of Japan, allowing the seawater to flow into and mix with the freshwater of the lake. An infrastructure of roads and bridges allows car traffic to cross this lake, as well visit the two islands located here: Eshima Island and Daikon Island.
