Jupiter - The largest planet, Jupiter's radius is a staggering 69,911 km (43,441 mi), and its diameter is about 139,822 km (86,881 mi). It is 11.21 times the size of Earth. However, the diameter of the Sun is about 10 times greater ...

Our solar system is made up of a star--the Sun--eight planets, 146 moons, a bunch of comets, asteroids and space rocks, ice, and several dwarf planets, such as Pluto. Besides knowing the planets' order, we must also insert planets into one of two category systems. The first classification system labels planets by size and composition: The first four planets in order from the Sun--Mercury, Venus, Earth, and Mars--are all small, with rocky surfaces and orbits close to one another.

Earth was not regarded as a planet, but rather the core object around which all other celestial objects revolved. Aristarchus of Samos presented the first known model that positioned the Sun at the center of the known universe, with the Earth revolving around it, in the third century BCE, but it was not widely accepted.
