



Where can you throw away batteries

There are many, many kinds of batteries. Some can be thrown away, some can't. Alkaline batteries have nothing hazardous in them and can go straight in the trash. Most other consumer batteries including lithium AAs and lithium-ion/lithium polymer, are hazardous and should be dropped off at your local hazardous waste disposal place.

Can You Throw Away Car and Truck Batteries? No, you can't just toss your old car battery in the trash. Car batteries contain heavy metals and chemicals that are hazardous to both people and the environment if not disposed of properly. A single lead-acid car battery can hold up to 18 pounds of lead and about a gallon of corrosive, lead ...

Fortunately, alkaline batteries haven't contained harmful materials for over 25 years, and the U.S. passed a law in 1996 phasing out the use of mercury in batteries, so progress has been made. In fact, unless you live in California, you've been tossing non-rechargeable batteries safely in the trash for at least 19 years.

Most people simply do not know if you can throw away alkaline batteries or if they need to be recycled through an electronic waste recycling facility. And the reality is every household uses alkaline batteries whether it is for the television remote controls, children's toys, alarm clocks, electric toothbrushes, and more.

You can also recycle e-waste with a local Best Buy, but be aware there may be a fee of almost \$30 per item for computer monitors and TVs. Idaho. out your alkaline batteries in the trash (unless you live in California), you could also recycle them so that the zinc, manganese dioxide, and steel parts can be harvested and used for new products.

Depending on which kind of battery you are recycling, battery components can become many different new products. Battery manufacturers frequently recycle spent battery components directly into new batteries. Steel can be recycled into kitchenware such as pots and pans, and silverware or cups and plates. It can sometimes be turned into asphalt.

Manage batteries under the lead-acid battery exclusion. If you reclaim or regenerate spent lead-acid batteries, you can manage them under the lead-acid battery waste exclusion (WAC 173-303-520). The exclusion requires that you: Recycle your lead-acid batteries. Store them properly on-site. Meet all other requirements noted in the exclusion.

When a battery is thrown away, we lose those resources outright--they can never be recovered. Recycling the batteries avoids air and water pollution, as well as greenhouse gas emissions. It also prevents batteries from being sent to facilities that are not equipped to safely manage them and where they could become a fire hazard.
